Started her professional debut touring Canada in Children's Theatre, followed by appearances in several feature films. This is Linda's first performance in the Cayman Islands.



PENNY PHILIPS

Started her amateur acting career in Kenya. She and her husband Peter are amongst the oldest and unquestionably most active members of the CDS. Penny's first performance for the CDS was in "Love is a Luxury", followed by one in "Sailor Beware". She directed the Society's first pantomime and her many back-stage responsibilities have included Sound, Lighting, and Props. This is Penny's first-and long overdue-on-stage performance in 6 years.

Derek Benfield was born in Bradford, Yorkshire, and made his first appearances as an actor there at the Civic Playhouse. After three years in the Army he trained at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art, and his professional gagement was with Brian Rix's company in Ilkley. He has since appeared in a wide variety of roles in theatre, film and T.V. productions. His first play, The Young in Heart, was presented by Reginald Salberg at Preston Hippodrome in

1951, and in 1954 his popular farce, Wild Goose Chase, was produced in London. He now divides his time equally between acting and writing. Mr Benfield's other successful plays include Post Horn Gallop, Fish Out Of Water, Running Riot, Panic Stations and Murder for the Asking.

Caught On the Hop is a comedy for four men and four women. When Phil announces to his friend George that he has fallen for Julie, whom he met on the top of a bus, and will have to divorce his wife Maggie, George is concerned but not surprised—it has happened, and blown over, before. But he is surprised and appalled when he learns that Julie has been lent a house next door to Phil's, and that Phil is moving in with her immediately. The obliging George is persuaded to give a helping hand—thus setting in motion the most frenetic confusion of mistaken identities, plotting and counterplotting, that ever erupted into one quiet summer's day, starting with George being landed (in Julie's eyes) with the ownership of Phil's house—and thus of Phil's wife!
