

Judy's association with the stage goes back several years. She was a member of the well known English "Bluebell Girls" dancing team at nineteen and travelled extensively with them in Europe, South America and the Caribbean. She met Jack (Dr. Jack) in the Freeport Player's Guild of which she was secretary for two years, and together they anticipated future events by playing husband and wife in "Five Finger Exercise" in 1968.





EVELYN ANDRESEN

Evelyn and her husband have been coming to Cayman for about 12 years and of course she is well known now as the owner and coproprietor of the Almond Tree tearoom and gift shop. Evelyn has had many years of theatrical experience and has played parts as different as Lady Brockhurst in "Guys and Dolls".

Evelyn sings with the Cayman Singers and also has her own radio programme on ICCl radio, "Person to Person".

GALE SHAW

Coming from a theatrical family, Gale has been involved in the theatre for as long as she can remember. Having majored in Drama in college, she then completed two years of study at the American Academy of Dramatic Arts in New York. Her professional career began while living at the Rehearsal Club in New York - including performances in numerous stock companies, plays "Off Broadway", and 3 films (2 for television, and one for Columbia).



Since living in Cayman Gale has played "Lizzie" in Rainmaker, and is currently on the Committee of the Drama Society.

PETER HAY



KEITH BALL

Keith has been active in amateur dramatics from a very early age. In fact, so he tells us, he tried to dramatise and produce his own version of "Peter Pan" from the original book at the age of ten. Even the flying sequences were written in but unfortunately the project failed and Peter Pan never got off the ground!

After leaving school, which was really the cradle of his thespian interests, Keith became involved in Youth Drama for 5 years, the group winning a number

of first class awards in London Drama Festivals.



Some of the plays in which he has performed comprise: The All Importance Of Being Earnest, George And Margaret, Doctor In The House, Wait Until Dark, The Rainmaker, My Three Angels, Love's A Luxury and Black Comedy.

Keith has been totally involved in the Cayman Drama Society since 1970 and produced "Worm's Eye View" for them last year. He is presently engaged jointly with Nick Press in the production of a number of Radio Plays for Radio I.C.C.I. and hopes to produce the next stage play for the Soceity.

He is a professional photographer by trade, likes diving when he has the time and is a keen audiophile.
