A MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

"The Pirate Princess" is based upon the real-life story of Mary Read and Ann Bonny who sailed aboard the ship of John' "Calico-Jack" Rackham which was captured off the west coast of Jamaica in 1726. They were discovered to be women only after being sentenced to death for piracy.

A light-hearted story line was added the rather grussome tale by dismantist Barbara Gloudon and set to music by Cornoy Cooper. "The Princes" became one of the most successful in a series of National Pantomines produced by the Little Theatre Movement in Jamaica, and was then performed by the Temba Theatre Company in London's West End.

I should like to express by thanks to the dedicated cast and crew who have all put in tremendous efforts over the past two months and have been very supportive and patient during my debut as a director. Normally it is unfair to single out individuals for special praise, but IT must mention the following people who have devoted their talents above and beyond the call of duty.

When I first asked Chuck Quappe to act as Musical Director, he readily agreed, but it later became apparent that most of the original music had been destroyed by Hurricane Gilbert.

However, working from limited material coased from the memories of the composer, the playwright, and some members of the original cast. Chuck and his wile Barrie have resurrected much of the music, added some of their own arrangements, and where gaps still existed have written new numbers which are now being performed for the first time.

There is also one member of the CDS who is involved in nearly every production although is rarely seen by the public (nor, in recent months, by his wife, employees, or customers). Peter Phillips took on the davanting task of Stage Manager on top of working night and day to build and equip the theater there months ahead of schedule so that this production could on on.

Finally, thanks to you the audience for supporting the first production in our new home. I hope you enjoy the show and will return regularly for many more happy hours of live entertainment.


