

Annie Synopsis

It first opened on Broadway as a musical in 1977 and was nominated for 11 Tony Awards and won 7, including Best Musical, Best Original Score and Best Book.

Annie resides in a miserable orphanage managed by the tyrannical Miss Hannigan who keeps the little girl orphans in line by threatening them. The girls are ever hopeful of finding their parents and happiness. Annie escapes to find her parents and runs into a friendly dog called Sandy. She is however returned to the orphanage but her fortunes change when she is picked by Grace Farrell, Oliver Warbucks assistant, to live in "Daddy" Warbucks mansion for the Christmas holidays.

Annie and Daddy Warbucks come to love each other but when Warbucks tries to adopt her, Annie insists that her parents will come for her. Warbucks offers a reward for the parents to come forward and Miss Hannigan, her brother, Rooster and his dizzy blonde girlfriend, Lily, scheme to pretend to be the parents and collect the reward.
